“The writing on the wall” is an expression we still use today. It refers to an expectation of judgment or misfortune.

This phrase comes directly from the book of Daniel. God had used the Babylonians as His agent of judgment on the rebellious nation of Judah. Now, “the writing on the wall” was for Babylon.

In **Daniel 5:1-31**, the Most High God warned Babylon of imminent judgment with His handwriting on the wall of the king’s palace.

Main Lesson: People and nations that _____ against God must learn to see the handwriting on the wall.
